### Recording Videos for the session of parallel talks

These are the guidelines on how to produce your video to ease the editing process.

If you have a webcam installed:

We recommend using [OBS Studio](#), a free screen recorder software. [This 5-minute tutorial](#) will help you to install and configure everything you need in order to record both slideshows and yourself.

If you don't have a webcam installed:

Record your presentation in two different files to send to us. One file should contain the recording of your slideshow with [OBS Studio](#) and the other should contain the video of yourself, recorded with a smartphone. We will make the edition of your presentation from the two files. To avoid an unfaithful timing of slide changing during your recorded presentation, it is an important request from the video-editing staff that both files be sent as videos.

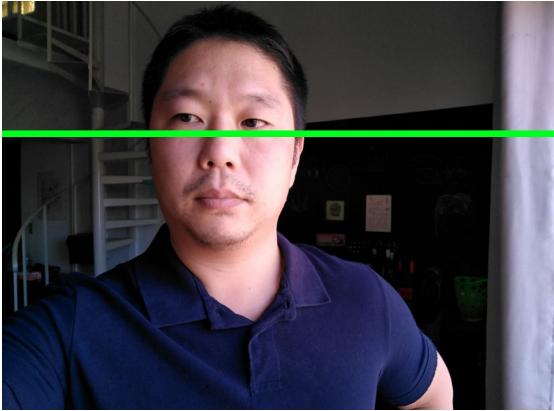
General guidelines to record with cameras (smartphone and/or webcam):

- Try to record in a room with good lighting, preferably indirect sunlight.
- Do not position the light source behind you. Ideally it should be about 45° up in front of you:



- Place the camera on a tripod or on something similar.
- Place the smartphone about the same height of your eyes.

- When framing the video, try to place your eyes around the top third of the image, as the image below.



- for better sound quality it's better to use a mic, but if not possible, record in a closed room.
